



East Tennessee Foundation Scholarship Guide

Ten Basic Steps to Application Process:

1. Determine which scholarships are available for either your county of residence or the location of your high school.
2. Determine scholarships for which you are eligible.
3. Contact references.
4. Complete and submit Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) (beginning January 1, 2012). (See Step Eight for exceptions.)
5. Gather materials needed to complete application.
6. Complete a separate *2012 East Tennessee Foundation (ETF) Application Form* for each scholarship.
7. Complete Personal Statement.
8. Prepare additional scholarship-specific materials.
9. Organize all application materials.
10. Submit completed application by March 1, 2012.

Step Two: Determine Scholarships for which you are eligible.

B&W Y-12 Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2004 for the benefit of graduating high school seniors wishing to pursue careers in science or pre-engineering fields.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,300 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Anderson, Blount, Campbell, Claiborne, Cocke, Knox (TN), Loudon, Morgan, Roane, or Sevier County
 - **Education requirement:** Graduating high school seniors
 - **Field of Study:** Science, for example, bio-medical engineering, environmental science, physics, chemistry, or pre-engineering. Please note: this scholarship is **not** intended for those seeking to be health care professionals.
 - **GPA minimum:** 3.0
 - **College/ Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at Roane State Community College, Pellissippi State Community College, Walters State Community College, or Maryville College
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**
 - **Additional Requirements:**
 - U.S. Citizenship
 - ACT minimum: 19 composite

Coach Jack Blair Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 1999 by Scott Niswonger to honor Coach Jack Blair for his more than 26 years of outstanding service as coach of the Lady Devils basketball team.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$750 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors of Greeneville High School
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Mimimum:** Not Applicable
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited college, university, community college or technical school
 - **Financial Need:** Not Applicable
 - **Additional Requirement:** Member of Lady Devils basketball team

Ruby A. Brown Memorial Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2003 by Mr. Carroll Brown to honor his wife and her twenty-five years as a public health nurse.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$3,000 one-time award for 1 year

- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Anderson, Blount, Campbell, Claiborne, Cocke, Grainger, Hamblen, Jefferson, Loudon, Monroe, Morgan, Roane, Scott, Sevier, or Union County
 - **Education Requirement:** Adult students or graduating high school seniors. Open to former recipients. Former recipients must re-apply each year.
 - **Field of Study:** Preference given to current public health nurses continuing education. Also open to current (preferably public health) nursing students pursuing a nursing career (preferably public health).
 - **GPA Minimum:** Not Applicable
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full or part-time enrollment at accredited, not-for-profit nursing program
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

Harold W. Canfield Memorial Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2009 to memorialize the life of Hal Canfield, the founding member of the Knoxville Track Club.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,200 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Anderson, Blount, Campbell, Grainger, Jefferson, Knox (TN), Loudon, Roane, Sevier, or Union County
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating high school seniors
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Minimum:** 3.0
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited not-for-profit college or university
 - **Financial Need:** Not Applicable
 - **Additional Requirements:**
 - Participation in Youth Athletic Program (YAP) of the Knoxville Track Club
 - U.S. Citizenship

Vera and Lawrence Carson Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 1999 by Donald K. Carson, Thomas M. Carson, Robert L. Carson, and Jane Carson Lewis to honor their parents.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,500 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Scott County
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduates of Oneida High School
 - **GPA Minimum:** Not Applicable
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited not-for-profit college or university
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**
 - **Additional Requirement:** Demonstrated leadership and qualities of citizenship

Karolyn King Carter Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in March, 2005, by Karolyn's family to honor her dedication to and love of the visual arts.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,500 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors at Greeneville High School
 - **Field of Study:** Fine arts, commercial arts, or media arts
 - **GPA Minimum:** 3.0
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment in an accredited not-for-profit college or university
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

- **Additional Requirements:**
 - Statement of art philosophy
 - 5 slides/photographs of applicant's work

Gordon W. and Agnes P. Cobb Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 1996, through a bequest left by Agnes P. Cobb Yoakum, the Cobb Scholarship supports students pursuing a medical-related degree.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$10,000 per year award for 4 years
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating senior of high school located in Blount, Loudon, or Knox (TN) County, or current college/university student who graduated from a high school located in Blount, Loudon, or Knox (TN) County
 - **Field of Study:** medical or health care related
 - **GPA Minimum:** 3.0
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment in an accredited public or private, not-for-profit college or university in the state of Tennessee
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**
 - **Additional Requirements:**
 - Applicants from single parent families given special consideration.
 - Strong work or volunteer history considered.
 - High school must submit statement of number of absences over high school career.

Steven L. Coffey Memorial Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 1988 by Pat and David Coffey in honor of their son, a talented and successful business and family man. The intent of the scholarship is to provide assistance to students who may not display the highest scholastic rankings, yet still possess great potential and motivation. The scholarship includes the services of a College Support Service Coordinator dedicated to assisting recipients with academic achievement and personal mentoring.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,200-\$1,600 per year award for 4 years
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Anderson County
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors, adult students, GED recipients
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Minimum:** 2.5
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at Roane State Community College or Pellissippi State Community College for at least one year. May transfer to an accredited public, not-for-profit college or university in the state of Tennessee.
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

Craighead Limestone Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established by the C.S. Sands family in 1998 to provide assistance to graduates of Sequoyah High School in Madisonville, TN.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$2,750 per year award for 4 years
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors of Sequoyah High School
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Minimum:** 2.5
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited, not-for-profit college or university
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

R.G. and Ruth Crossno Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established by Mrs. R.G. Crossno and family in 1990 in memory of R.G. Crossno. Following the death of Mrs. Crossno, her name was added to the scholarship.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,400 per year award for 4 years
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors of Anderson County High School
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Minimum:** 2.0
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at accredited public or private not-for-profit university or community college
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**
 - **Additional requirement:** History of volunteer or paid work

Michael D. Curtin Renaissance Student Memorial Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2000 by family and friends of Michael D. Curtin, to benefit graduating seniors of Anderson County High School. It is intended to benefit students who demonstrate leadership or achievement in a balanced array of activities, including: arts, athletics, citizenship, community/religion, and scholarship.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,000 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors of Anderson County High School
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Minimum:** Not Applicable
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited public or private not-for-profit university, technical or community college
 - **Financial Need:** Not Applicable

James K. Goldston INFOSEC Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2006 by the family of James K. Goldston to provide assistance to students from Tennessee to pursue undergraduate programs of study with a National Security Agency (NSA)-approved Information Security (INFOSEC) curriculum.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,000 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Anderson, Blount, Campbell, Carter, Claiborne, Cocke, Grainger, Greene, Hamblen, Hancock, Hawkins, Jefferson, Johnson, Knox (TN), Loudon, McMinn, Monroe, Morgan, Roane, Scott, Sevier, Sullivan, Unicoi, Union, or Washington County
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating high school seniors, college/university students enrolling in first, second, third, or fourth year of the program, and non-traditional students
 - **Field of Study:** NSA-approved INFOSEC curriculum
 - **GPA Minimum:** 2.5-3.5, preferred
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time undergraduate programs of study at an NSA-approved INFOSEC curriculum. Please use the following link:

 - **Must demonstrate financial need**
 - **Additional Requirements:**
 - U.S. Citizenship.
 - Special consideration given to non-traditional students and applicants demonstrating commitment to Tennessee schools (e.g. Fountainhead College of Technology in Knoxville, the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, and the University of Memphis).

Fund for Greene County Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 1998 by the Board of Advisors of the Fund for Greene County to benefit the residents of Greeneville and Greene County.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,500 one-time award for 1 year

- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Greene County
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors of Chuckey-Doak High School, Greeneville High School, North Greene High School, South Greene High School, West Greene High School, or a Greene County resident with a GED
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Minimum:** 2.5
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited public or private not-for-profit university, community college
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**
 - **Additional Requirement:** Special consideration to applicants demonstrating commitment to Greene County and to non-traditional students.

Michael David Greene Memorial Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in memory of Michael David Greene by David, Janet, and Jennifer Greene in 1996 to provide scholarships to talented students who exhibit Michael's qualities of real and fervent effort, kindness, courage, determination, and dignity, and who are or have been members of the Farragut High School (FHS) band. - **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,500 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating high school senior from Farragut High School
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Minimum:** 3.0
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited public or private not-for-profit college/university
 - **Financial Need:** Not Applicable
 - **Additional Requirement:** Must be involved in FHS band program

John D. Grubb and Louise G. Sumner Fund for Monroe County Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Originally established in 1999 by John Grubb and Louise Sumner to provide scholarships to Hiwassee students and Hiwassee graduates going on to 4-year college or university. The scholarship has been expanded to include any Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) accredited public or private, non-profit college or university in Tennessee.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$2,000 per year award for 4 years
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Monroe County
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduates of a Monroe County High School, graduating seniors or current college students
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Requirement:** 2.5
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) accredited public or private, non-profit college or university in Tennessee or Hiwassee College
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

Jack F. and Edith Updyke Harmon Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2007 by Edith Updyke Harmon in memory of her husband, Jack, to provide scholarship assistance to students from certain high schools, intending to attend specific institutions of higher education.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$5,000 per year for 4 years
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable

- **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors from Tennessee High School in Bristol, TN; Virginia High School, and John S. Battle High School, both in Bristol, VA; Sullivan Central High School in Blountville, TN; or Bland High School in Bland, VA.
- **Field of Study:** Music, art, agriculture, math, or science
- **GPA Minimum:** 3.0
- **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at one of the following institutions: Emory & Henry College, King College, East Tennessee State University or the University of Tennessee College of Agriculture in Knoxville
- **Must demonstrate financial need**

Johnson County Education Growth Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2002 through a gift from the Levi Strauss Foundation with support from Johnson County businesses, banks, individuals, and the Johnson County Community Foundation, to provide a source of financial aid to Johnson County residents.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,000 per year award for 2 years
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Johnson County for a minimum of 12 months
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating high school seniors or returning adult students or GED recipient
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA minimum:** 2.0
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited two-year or four-year college or university or non-traditional higher education program or trade school, accredited by the appropriate accrediting body for the particular course of study
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

Johnson County Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2000 by anonymous donors to provide Johnson County High School graduates the opportunity to continue their education at the college/university of their choice. It is the desire of the donors to recognize those students who may not have the highest scholastic rankings, but who have the potential to successfully complete college.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$7,500 per year award for 4 years
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Johnson County
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors of Johnson County High School
 - **Field of Study:** Not Applicable
 - **GPA Minimum:** 2.5
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited public or private not-for-profit university/college
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

Dr. Richard Forrest & Ella Dudney Kelsey Memorial Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established by friends and family of Dr. and Mrs. Richard Kelsey in 1996 as a tribute to their lifetime commitment to community service in their respective fields.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,000 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Not Applicable
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors of Collierville High School
 - **Field of Study:** Pursuing a career as an educator or health care professional
 - **GPA Minimum:** Not Applicable
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited Tennessee public, not-for-profit university or community college
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

Dorsey and Betty King Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 2007 by Brian King in honor of his parents, Dorsey and Betty King, who grew up in Claiborne County and now reside in Campbell County.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,000 one-time award for 1 year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Campbell or Claiborne County
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating seniors from Claiborne or Campbell county high schools
 - **Field of Study:** business or registered nursing.
 - **GPA Minimum:** Not Applicable
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at an accredited public or private, not-for-profit college, university or nursing program
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**

Knoxville Business Association Scholarship

- **Purpose and History:** Established in 1997 by the Knoxville Business Association to benefit students pursuing a business-related degree from the University of Tennessee-Knoxville.
- **Scholarship Amount:** \$1,000 first year; \$1,500 second year; \$2,000 third year; \$2,500 fourth year
- **Eligibility Requirements:**
 - **Residency Requirement:** Knox County, TN
 - **Education Requirement:** Graduating senior from public or private high school located in Knox County
 - **Field of Study:** Business
 - **GPA:** 3.0
 - **College/Enrollment Requirement:** Full-time enrollment at University of Tennessee-Knoxville
 - **Must demonstrate financial need**
 - **Additional Requirement:** Preference given to students who intend to work in Knoxville.

Knox Central High Class of '50 Alumni Association Scholarship

Step Four: Complete Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Visit www.FAFSA.ed.gov beginning January 1, 2012, to complete and submit FAFSA.

Make two copies of your completed FAFSA and SAR, one to be sent with your completed application packet, and one for your own records.(See Step Eight for exceptions to this requirement.)

Be sure to allow time for your FAFSA to be processed and for you to receive your SAR to ensure your application is received by the deadline.

Step Five: Gather application materials needed to complete the 2012 East Tennessee Foundation Application Form.

Statement should not exceed one 8 1/2 by 11 page. Be sure your name appears on the top right corner of the page.
